Subjected to 22 hours of interrogation, torture and beating by South African police on September 6, 1977, Steve Biko died six days later. Donald Woods, Biko's close friend and a leading white South African newspaper editor, exposed the murder helping to ignite the black revolution.

BIKO by Donald Woods Steve Biko died in police custody on September 12, 1977, six days after being arrested by South African police. An unauthorized (secret) autopsy revealed brain trauma caused by severe blows to the head was the cause of death.

Woods founded the Lincoln Trust which helped to secure university education for exiled South Africans in Britain, America, Canada and Australia during the '80s and '90s. In 1987, Richard Attenborough directed the film Cry Freedom, about the friendship that developed between Woods and Steve Biko, based on the books written by Woods, Biko, and Asking for Trouble.

Donald James Woods, CBE (15 December 1933 – 19 August 2001) was a South African journalist and anti-apartheid activist. As editor of the Daily Dispatch, he was known for befriending fellow activist Steve Biko, who was killed by the police after being detained by the South African government.

On 13 August 1977, Steve Biko was arrested, interrogated and beaten. On 12 September he was dead. Editor of a leading anti-apartheid paper, Donald Woods was a friend of Steve Biko and went into exile in order to write his testimony about the life and work of a remarkable man.

Woods's book Biko (1978) and his personal experiences as described in his autobiography, Asking for Trouble (1981), inspired the 1987 film Cry Freedom. In 1978 he was the first private citizen invited to address the UN Security Council. Woods was made CBE in 2000, shortly before his last book, Rainbow Nation Revisited, was published.

Woods and his entire family (wife and five surviving children) escaped to England via Lesotho after Biko died, and there Woods became an active speaker against apartheid. He spoke in the U.S. and before the U.N. Security Council. Woods died in 2001 of cancer, after traveling back to South Africa after apartheid ended.

South African Minister of Justice James (Jimmy) Kruger initially suggested Biko had died of a hunger strike and said that his death "left him cold." The hunger strike story was dropped after local and international media pressure, especially from Donald Woods, the editor of the East London Daily Dispatch.
