Chapter 22: The Shoulder Complex. Overview. The shoulder complex, as the name implies, is an extremely complicated region of the body. Sports using the shoulder in repetitive activities, such as throwing, blocking, tacking, or rolling over, as in tumbling, may produce a serious injury.

The bones that comprise the shoulder complex and shoulder joint are the clavicle, scapula, and humerus (Figure 18–2). These three bones form the four major articulations associated with the shoulder complex: the sternoclavicular joint, the acromioclavicular joint, the glenohumeral joint, and the scapulothoracic joint.

Signs associated with Grade 1,2,3 AC joint sprains. Grade 1- Point tenderness and discomfort with movement. Grade 2- Point tenderness. Can not go through full ROM or bring arm completely across chest. Grade 3-Rupture of the acromioclavicular and caracoclavicular ligaments with dislocation of the clavicle. Gross deformity.

Shoulder Impingement Syndrome: Definition. This shoulder injury is caused by a decreased space in the glenohumeral joint, because of tendonitis or bursitis. Term. Falling on an extended arm. Definition. A lot of shoulder sprains, fractures, separations, and dislocations occur from this mechanism of injury.
