Documentation should reflect the nature of services provided and the clinical reasoning of the occupational therapy practitioner, and it should provide enough information to ensure that services are delivered in a safe and effective manner. Documentation should describe the depth and breadth of services provided to meet the complexity of individual client³ needs. The client's diagnosis or prognosis should

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
