Medication Calculation Examination . Study Guide . D = Desired Dose . Q = Quantity of Solution . H = Strength on Hand . X = Unknown quantity of Drug • Sample: Physician orders 500 mg of ibuprofen (desired Dose) for a patient and you have 250 mg (Quantity on Hand) tablets (Quantity of solution) on hand.. Solution: $D \div H \times Q = X$ $500\text{mg} \div 250 \text{ mg} \times 1 \text{ tablet} = 2 \text{ tablets}$

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
