Having a plan in place is crucial. The 10 steps to an effective sensory integration session are listed below. This list of 10 process elements reflect key strategies from the Ayres Sensory Integration and was developed as part of the Ayres Sensory Integration Fidelity Measure.

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### Handwriting Club: Using Sensory Integration Strategies to ...

Reduce the need for handwriting (for example, use fill-in-the-blank questions instead of short-answer questions). Allow extra time for writing to accommodate motor skills fatigue and trouble with proprioception. Let the student use speech-to-text software or a computer. Reduce the amount of visual information on a page.

Sensory Diet Programs involving a daily routine/plan with a menu of individualized, supportive sensory strategies (e.g., rocking chair, quiet space, aromatherapy, weighted blanket), identified physical activities (e.g., yoga, swimming) and materials (e.g., sensory kits containing music, stress balls, items for distraction).

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
