To facilitate this effort, a new version of the Greek text has been developed, which is meant to better represent the Greek text upon which the Sahidic was based. This text is entitled ""The New Testament According to the Egyptian Greek Text"" [New TestamentAEG] This text does not include representation of either accents or supralinear strokes, since these are used inconsistently in the original texts.

Coptic is the final stage of the evolution of Egyptian (the words "Copt" and "Coptic" are much-distorted versions of the name "Aigypt[os]").
