Ayres developed 17 standardized tests and many non-standardized observations that contributed to the identification and understanding of the multiple patterns of sensory integration dysfunction. Her original tests, the Southern California Sensory Integration Tests (SCSIT) were revised and expanded and in 1986 published as the Sensory Integration and Praxis Tests (SIPT).
