Sojourner Truth (ca. 1797-1883) was a black American freedom fighter and orator. She believed herself chosen by God to preach His word and to help with the abolitionist effort to free her people. Truth was born into slavery in Swartekill, New York, but escaped with her infant daughter to freedom in 1826.After going to court to recover her son in 1828, she became the first black woman to win such a case against ...
